- build a new Emergency Department;
- re-develop the existing Diagnostic Imaging Department; and,
- construct user friendly access to services

This expansion is one of the largest efforts undertaken by the Norfolk General Hospital and is a crucial step towards the delivery of quality health care in the 21st century. This expansion will help to ensure that the citizens of Norfolk County receive the best health care, right here in the community.

Since the founding era of the Hospital, in 1925, NGH continuously strives to provide the very best of care for our residents.

The last major capital campaign — *The Thanks a Million Campaign* — was launched in 1983 to equip NGH with Intensive Care beds and enhanced cardiac monitoring. The community poured its efforts and financial contributions into this successful endeavour. And now, as we enter a new century, NGH must again turn to the community.

The Norfolk General Hospital has begun its fundraising efforts and has appointed a Campaign Cabinet, chaired by Donna Raytrowsky. Included on the Cabinet are: Len
