Guest Speaker was Sandy (exchange student from Australia). Sandy began by saying that he really

wanted an exchange to Switzerland, rather than Canada — but Canada is nice. His authentic Aussie sense of humour was apparent throughout the presentation.

Sandy presented slides of his country and its famous landmarks, such as the Great Barrier Reef, Sydney Opera House, Parliament buildings. He lives in Brisbane, on the continent's east coast in the state of Queensland. He was very



informative about his homeland and its attributes. Most Australians can be traced back to their unsavory roots as exiled British criminals sent to settle the new continent.
